Want to build your English language skills to successfully study at a UK university?

Whether you intend to study at Foundation, Undergraduate or Postgraduate level in the UK, our online Pre-Sessional English course combines academic and social language skills to help you get there.

Why study Pre-Sessional English?

- Meet the English language entry requirements necessary of a QA partner university programme.
- Focus on content-specific vocabulary, academic writing, reading, listening and speaking.
- Develop your confidence in an Englishspeaking academic environment.
- Familiarise yourself with British culture before starting university.
- Study a 5, 10, or 15 week programme to develop your English language skills, before progressing onto your chosen course.

What will I study?

Through online social and academic activities and tasks, you will gain the necessary skills to successfully complete a UK university programme.

- 15 week programme: focus on developing your reading, writing, speaking and listening skills, as well as vocabulary, grammar and pronunciation in both academic and social settings.
- 10 and 5 week programme: develop the necessary language and academic skills required to achieve the most from your future degree through critical thinking, discussion and analysis.
- 99% of students progressed onto their desired degree after successfully passing the course in 2022/23*
- Progression is not guaranteed and the course requires the full commitment of each student to successfully complete the course.

On completion of the course you will be able to undertake all aspects required of university study, as well as confidently socialise in informal settings.
